
Drivers



- CY2000: Discontinuation of Selective Availability
- Services dependent on GPS seen as an engine for economic growth and enhancing development
- Growth and diversity of civil and commercial apps
- Evolution of GPS into a global utility
- Emergence of foreign GNSS
- Need for a multi-use approach to program planning, resource allocation, system development, and ops

The EXCOM shall:



- Make Recommendations to:
 - Departments and Agencies
 - The President
- Advise and Coordinate:
 - Policies
 - Architectures
 - Requirements
 - Resource Allocation
- Promote the use of U.S. space-based PNT services

- Resolution of Interdepartmental Issues
- Funding for new Civil Capabilities
 - Curb appetite for a "free good"
 - Ensure "skin in the game"
- Assured Access to PNT
- International Cooperation
- Modernization



Reflections



- Structure put in place by the national policy mostly successful at:

 - Informing/advising senior leadership
